Kumite Competition Rules (International Karatedo Federation Rules - Elementary School Level - For World Championships/All Japan Championships/Selection Events)

Revised November 12, 2023

1. Referee Standards: The Panel of Referees and the Review Panel shall have equal authority in judging the competition. However, all final decisions regarding the competition shall be subject to the approval of the Chief Referee (*Shinpancho*). Calls such as *ippon*, *waza-ari*, *hansoku*, *jo-gai*, or *hantei* require the judgment of at least three of the five referees to be valid. Judgments by two or fewer referees, or by the Chief Referee alone, are not valid. However, each of the five referees has the right to raise objections and discuss them. The standard match duration is as follows. However, if deemed necessary, the Chief Referee may, at their discretion, set a new time limit. The tournament schedule will be followed as closely as possible. However, in unavoidable circumstances, the Chief Referee may instruct changes after consultation with the Review Panel..

2. Match Duration:① Semifinals and earlier : Main Bout (1:30) → Extension (1:00, Must-Decision) ② Finals: Main Bout (1:30) →Extension (1:00)→Final Extension (1:00, Must-Decision).

3. Protective Gear: Class | Head Guard | Knuckle Support | P Gloves | Shin | Knee | Groin Guard/Women's Underguard | Women's Chest Guard || Elementary School and Below | ○ | ○ | × | ○ | 3+ Years ○ | ○ | 3+ Years ○||

* All protective gear must be prepared by each participant. All protective gear must be made of white cloth.

* Headguards must meet the following conditions; no restrictions on manufacturer or logo (e.g., Kyokushin, JKJO). The body of the gear must be white, made of sponge-filled vinyl leather or similar material, and include a face shield. Face shield shape, color, and material are unrestricted. Isami TT-25, TT-300, Martial World HG-17, and other manufacturers' models are acceptable. A red ribbon for the red (*Aka*) side must also be prepared as part of the set.

* Fist protectors: must bear the Kyokushin, Shieijyuku, or JKJO logo. If using identical-shaped products from Isami or Martial World, approval from the Chief Referee must be obtained on the day of the tournament. Refer to the separate document "Kumite Protective Gear Guide" for details.

* Knee Guards: Mandatory for 3rd grade and above. Girls' Chest Guards: Prohibited for 2nd grade and below; mandatory for 3rd grade and above.

* All competitors must wear groin guards or girls' underguards. These must be worn inside the pants.

* Girls' chest guards must be IBKO Defense Chester, Martial World CG32, Isami L-711, TT-28, or equivalent in material and shape. Guards covering the entire torso are prohibited.

* Girls' inner T-shirts must be white only.

* Only taping approved by the tournament doctor (medical staff) is permitted. Hard tape is prohibited.

4. Karate-gi: Wear a clean karate gi and affix the bib number to the center of the back.

5. Winning by *Ippon*: ① Instantly landing a punch, kick, etc. to a valid target area (excluding the foul zone), causing damage that knocks the opponent down, or causing damage that makes the opponent cry or lose the will to fight. ② Accumulating two *waza-ari* results in an *ippon-gachi* (winning by ippon).

6. *Waza-ari*: ① Instantly landing a punch, kick, etc., to a valid target area (excluding the foul zone), causing the opponent to temporarily stop moving, become significantly unbalanced, adopt a crouched defensive posture, or begin dragging their feet. ② Landing an unblocked *jodan* knee kick to an unguarded opponent (,however, *jodan* knee kicks are prohibited for elementary school students and younger). ③ When a *mae-geri* front kick, *gedan-geri* low kick, *ashi-kake* leg sweep, etc., cleanly knocks the opponent down, and a *gedan-tsuki* low punch is instantly and perfectly timed. Referees may award a point even without the *gedan-tsuki*. ④ When a *gedan-tsuki* is instantly and perfectly timed after evading a *do-mawashi-kaiten-geri*. ⑤ If kicks land on both fighters at exactly the same moment, it is considered a simultaneous hit, and neither is awarded a point.

7. *Hantei* (Decision): When there is no *ippon-gachi* or *shikkaku* (disqualification), the decision is made by a majority vote of the referees (Chief and Assistant referees). The priority order for decision-making is: ① *Waza-ari* ② Damage ③ Effective strike ④ Aggressiveness. However, if a *chu-i* warning has been issued, the decision follows the separate table “Criteria of the Decision (Illustrated)”. If no decision is reached, an overtime period is held. If overtime also ends without a decision, a final overtime period (only in the final bout) is held to determine the winner.

8. *Hansoku* (Fouls) ① Striking the face, neck, or throat with hands or elbows. ② Kicking the groin or headbutting. ③ *Jo-dan hiza-geri* strikes. (*Chu-i* given if landed). ④ Striking a fallen opponent. ⑤ Striking from behind. ⑥ Intentional *jo-gai* (stepping out of bounds), ⑦ *Sho-tei oshi* palm push, *sho-ken oshi* fist push, grabbing, throwing, *tegake* (hand hooking) and clinching. ⑧ Attacks with the head or chest leaning against the opponent. ⑨ Attack and escape (e.g., kicking and immediately falling to avoid a counterattack). ⑩ Dangerous, sacrificing kicks (like *kaiten-do-mawashi-geri* kicks) and the like are limited to one per bout segment (once in the main bout, once in each extension). Repeating this beyond the limit is considered a foul. ⑪ Unnecessarily leaning into the opponent to nullify their technique. ⑫ Any other action deemed a *hansoku* by the referee. ⑬ Fouls result in *chu-i* warnings; four *chu-i* lead to disqualification. *Chu-i* is given to the initiator of the foul. ⑭ Malicious *hansoku* (fouls) may result in *shikkaku* after just one occurrence.

9. *Genten* (Penalties) : ① When two *chu-i* are issued. ② When committing a malicious *hansoku*. ③ When deemed to have a malicious attitude by the referee's judgment. ④ Two *genten* (penalties) result in *shikkaku* (disqualification).

10. *Shikkaku* (Disqualification) ① When two *genten* (penalties) are incurred. ② When a competitor fails to follow the referee's instructions and is deemed to have a malicious attitude during the match. “War cries,” “victory poses,” or cheering phrases like “That hit him!” or “Take him down!” directed at the opponent may result in *shikkaku*. ③ When vomiting occurs during the match (before the referee signals the end of the match). ④ When arriving late for the match or failing to appear. ⑤ *Shikkaku* may also occur for malicious spectator behavior. ⑥ When exceeding the specified weight at the day's weigh-in. (Disqualified if

exceeding by 2kg or more while wearing karate gi) ⑦ A difference of 5kg or more between declared weight and actual weigh-in weight may also result in *shikkaku*. ⑧ When an opponent becomes unable to continue the match due to a *hansoku*.

11. Other: No protests against judging decisions will be accepted.

Kumite Competition Rules (International Karatedo Federation Rules - Junior High School to General / World Championships / All Japan Championships / Selection Events)

Revised November 12, 2023

1. Referee Standards: The Panel of Referees and the Review Panel shall have equal authority in judging the competition. However, all final decisions regarding the competition shall be subject to the approval of the Chief Referee. Calls such as *ippon*, *waza-ari*, *hansoku*, *jo-gai*, or *hantei* require the judgment of at least three of the five referees to be valid. Judgments by two or fewer referees, or by the Chief Referee alone, are not valid. However, each of the five referees has the right to raise objections and discuss them. The standard match duration is as follows. However, if deemed necessary, the Chief Referee may, at their discretion, set a new time limit. The tournament schedule will be followed as closely as possible. However, in unavoidable circumstances, the Chief Referee may instruct changes after consultation with the Review Panel.

2. Match Duration

① Men's Division: Main Bout: 2 min → Extension: 2 min → Final: 2 min

(Semifinals/Finals): Main Bout: 3 min → Extension: 2 min → Final: 2 min

② Women's Division, U18, U15: Main Bout: 2 min → Final: 2 min

(Semifinals/Finals): Main Bout 2 min → Extension 2 min → Final 2 min

③ All Other Categories: Main Bout 1 min 30 sec → Final 1 min 30 sec

(Semifinals/Finals): Main Bout 1 min 30 sec → Extension 1 min 30 sec → Final 1 min

*There is no weight decision. The final extension bout determines the winner.

* All protective gear must be prepared by each participant. All gear except P-gloves must be made of white cloth.

* Headguards must meet the following conditions; no restrictions on manufacturer or logo (e.g., Kyokushin or JKJO). The body must be white, made of sponge-filled vinyl leather or similar material, and must have a face shield attached or be designed for being detachable. Faceplate shape, color, and material are unrestricted. Isami TT-25, TT-300, Martial World HG-17, or other manufacturers' models are acceptable. A red ribbon for the *aka* (red) side must also be prepared as part of the set.

* P Gloves must be open-finger gloves with a Kyokushin tag (black leather) or the identical model PG36 with a Marshall World tag. Those wishing to purchase in advance should contact the tournament office.

* Groin guards and underguards must be worn inside the pants.

* Women's chest guards must be IBKO Defense Chester, Marshall World CG32, Isami L-711, TT-28, or equivalent in material and shape. Guards covering the entire torso are prohibited.

* Women's inner T-shirts must be white only.

* Only taping approved by the tournament doctor (medical staff) is permitted. Hard tape is prohibited.

4. *Karate-gi*: Wear a clean karate uniform and affix the bib number to the center of the back.

5. Winning by *Ippon*: *Ippon-gachi* winning by ippon is scored when a *tsuki*, *keri*, *hijiuchi*, etc., lands instantaneously on a valid target area (excluding the foul zone), causing the opponent to be down for 3 seconds or more, or to lose fighting spirit. Accumulating two *waza-ari* results in an *Ippon-gachi* (winning by ippon).

6. *Wazai-ari* (Point) ① A *tsuki*, *keri*, *hijiuchi*, etc., landing cleanly on a valid target area causes the opponent to temporarily go down or lose fighting spirit. If the opponent stands within 3 seconds or is not knocked down but loses balance significantly, it is a *waza-ari*. For all weight classes except General Men, a clean kick landing on an unguarded opponent also counts as *waza-ari*. *Jodan-hiza-geri* kicks are valid in all weight classes. ② When a *mae-geri* kick, *gedan-geri* kick, or *ashi-gake* sweep cleanly knocks the opponent down, followed by an instantly timed *gedan-tsuki* punch. ③ When a *gedan-tsuki* is instantly timed and landed after evading a *do-mawashi-kaiten-geri* kick.

7. *Hantei* (Decision): When there is no *ippon-gachi* or *shikkaku* (disqualification), the decision is made by a majority vote of the referees (chief and assistant referees). The priority order for decision-making is: ① *Waza-ari* ② Damage ③ Effective strike ④ Aggressiveness. However, if a *chu-i* warning has been issued, the decision follows the separate table "Criteria of the Decision (Illustrated)". If no decision is reached, an extension is held. If still undecided, a final extension bout determines the winner.

8. *Hansoku* (Fouls) ① Striking the face, neck, or throat with hands or elbows. Contact with fingertips may also be penalized. ② Kicks to the groin, headbutts. ③ Striking a fallen opponent. ④ Striking from behind. ⑤ Intentional *jo-gai* (stepping out of bounds). ⑥ *Sho-tei oshi* palm push, *sho-ken oshi* fist push, grabbing, throwing, *tegake* (hand hooking) and clinching. ⑦ Attack and escape (e.g., kicking and immediately falling

to prevent counterattack). ⑧ Dangerous, sacrificing kicks (like *kaiten-do-mawashi-geri* kicks) and the like are limited to one per bout segment (once in the main bout, once in each extension). Repeating this beyond the limit is considered a foul. ⑨ Unnecessarily leaning into the opponent to nullify their technique. ⑩ Any other action deemed a *hansoku* by the referee. ⑪ Fouls result in *chu-i* warnings; four *chu-i* lead to *shikkaku* (disqualification). *Chu-i* is given to the initiator of the foul. ⑫ Malicious *hansoku* (fouls) may result in *shikkaku* after just one occurrence.

9. *Genten* (Penalties): ① When two *chu-i* are issued. ② When committing a malicious foul. ③ When deemed to have a malicious attitude by the referee's judgment. ④ Two *genten* (penalties) result in *shikkaku* (disqualification).

10. *Shikkaku* (Disqualification): ① When two *genten* point deductions are incurred. ② When a competitor fails to follow the referee's instructions and is deemed to have a malicious attitude toward the match. "War cries," "victory poses," or cheering phrases directed at the opponent such as "That hit him!" or "Take him down!" may result in disqualification. ③ When vomiting occurs during the match (before the referee signals the end of the match). ④ *Shikkaku* may also occur for malicious spectator behavior. ⑤ When exceeding the specified weight at the day's weigh-in. (Disqualified if exceeding by 2kg or more while wearing karate gi) ⑥ A difference of 5kg or more between declared weight and actual weigh-in weight may also result in disqualification. ⑦ When an opponent becomes unable to continue the match due to a foul.

11. Other: No protests against decisions will be accepted.

IBKO World Championships / All Japan Championships / Selection Tournament Kumite Protective Gear Guide

Use white protective gear except P gloves.

Mandatory Gear

Head Guard: (Photos)

No manufacturer or logo (Kyokushin, JKJO) restrictions if meeting below conditions: Body must be white, made of sponge-filled vinyl leather or similar material, with face shield attached or detachable. Face shield shape/color/material unrestricted. Isami TT-25, TT-300, Martial World HG-17, and other manufacturers' products are acceptable. A red ribbon for the *aka* (red) side must also be prepared as part of the set.

All 4 types are usable.

Knuckle Support: Must bear the Kyokushin, JKJO, or Shieijyuku logo, or be an identical model manufactured by Isami or Marshall World (requires Chief Referee's approval mark).

P-Glove: Open-finger glove bearing the Kyokushin logo, or an identical model bearing the Marshall World tag (PG36). Use of JKJO-specified white leather gloves is prohibited.

Recommended Gear

Women's Underguard: (Photo)

Women's chest guard: Cup material must not be hard plastic. Items covering ribs or solar plexus are prohibited.
